Mission Statement

The SCYC Junior Sailing Program seeks to promote and facilitate a safe and fun learning environment, to inspire junior sailors within the marine environment, and to instill values and respect for the sport of sailing.

We aim to encourage junior sailors to experience the joy of sailing, whether it is recreational or racing oriented. US Sailing certified instructors will provide comfortable yet challenging instruction at each developmental level to ensure the progress and success of each sailor.

The emphasis of instruction will fall on each junior sailor's personal development as *an* ethical and responsible member of the sailing community, with stress on seamanship and sportsmanship.

Most importantly, it is our mission to introduce, foster and develop sailing skills that may encourage our junior sailors to enjoy and contribute to the sport of sailing beyond the scope of the junior program.

SCYC Junior Sailing Program

The SCYC Junior Sailing Program is open to children of members who will reach their eighth birthday but will not be eighteen by December 31. It consists of a seven week, all day program for beginners, intermediate and advanced sailors, using Optimists, Blue Jays, Pixels, Lasers, Laser Radial5 and Club 420 class boats.

Goals of SCYC Junior Sailing

Our primary goals are: safety fun and learning! More specifically, we aim to develop self confidence, appreciation, teamwork, self reliance, boat handling *and* seamanship skills.

JSA of LIS US Sailing

The JSA of LIS is the organization that supports its member junior sailing programs through leadership, training, communication and event scheduling, with programs located on tidewater in Connecticut and New York.

JSA is also a member of US SAILING and encourages all our members to be individual or family members of US SAILING and appropriate class associations.

Expectations of Sailors

Pre-season, each sailor must pass the swim check and, for boat owners, boat inspection. Boat inspection must be done before program begins. Coaches will be available.

Each junior sailor must acknowledge and adhere to specific safety rules, as well as behavioral guidelines stated in their *Junior Sailing Contract*.

Junior Sailors are expected to **follow the JSA Code of Ethics**.

It is the responsibility of each junior sailor to arrive every day prepared with the following:

- ***Appropriate Sailing Clothes:*** bathing suit and shoes (not flip flops) that can get wet and will not fall off while Swimming; *a* change of clothes, towel and sweatshirt, windbreaker, and/or foul weather gear. **WE SAIL IN THE RAIN**
- ***Sun Protection:*** sun block, hat *and* sunglasses.
- ***PFDF:*** personal flotation device with whistle attached; must fit properly and meet all USCG requirements.
- ***Equipment:*** for privately owned boats in good, safe, working condition. Please consult instructors if you have questions.
- ***Water Bottle***
- ***Positive Attitude!***

Expectations of Parents

It is important for parents to support the program, the instructors, and all the *Junior* Sailors.

Parent of the Day is vital to our program and important for parent *involvement*.

Constructive comments *and* suggestions are helpful to the program and can be submitted through the office.

Expectations of Instructors

Instructors are responsible for providing a safe and fun learning environment for Junior Sailors.

Throughout the curriculum, each instructor will work to design and implement effective lesson plans using a combination of lectures, demonstrations, land drills and water drills.

Each instructor is required to have the following certifications:

US Sailing Level

CPR and First Aid

NY State Power boating License

Instructors take attendance four times a day, fill out accident or infraction reports when necessary and are equipped with knowledge of an Emergency Action Plan.

It is imperative that you inform the head instructor if any special circumstances or conditions are important.

What to Expect on Daily Basis

9:15am: Sailors arrive, meeting their instructors in the proper place. Everyone reports to the Junior Room, attendance and lunch count is taken.

9:45am-12:30pm: Morning Sailing Class - rigging, land lesson, water drill.

12:30pm-1:30pm: Lunch

1:45pm-4:30pm: Afternoon Sailing Class - land lesson, water drill, de-rigging and debriefing.

4:30pm: Sailors are dismissed.

Please note: class assignment is based on boat class, sailor's age and skill level, and is at the discretion of the Head Instructor.

When and Why We Do Not Sail All The Time

On no wind or stormy days, Junior Sailing is still in session. These days provide an opportunity for land drills and fun activities, both sailing and non-sailing related.

Because our Junior Sailors sail most of the time, it is valuable to spend some time on land participating in varied activities such as rigging relay races, knot tying, sailing video viewing.

This helps mix up the routine, keeps *our* sailors motivated and most importantly, guarantees having fun.

Please recognize that very few sailors would enjoy sailing all day, every day and we do our best to prevent burn-out *and* boredom.

Similarly, even on good weather days, some time will be spent on land for on-shore lessons and learning.

Please be aware that not all sailing skills are acquired solely on the water, lectures and demonstrations are integral parts of the learning process.

Any member or parent with creative ideas or activities for non-sailing days (rain, no wind), please share them with the instructors!

Regattas and Regatta Registration

Throughout the summer, numerous sailors will attend regattas all over LI Sound and *beyond*.

Participation in these events is voluntary and at the discretion of the Head Instructor.

We would like to encourage parents to speak with their sailors before the start of the season about competing in Regattas during the summer.

Instructors are sent to every regatta in which Sea Cliff sailors are competing; they spend the day coaching and supervising the entrants.

Sailors wishing to attend a regatta must be registered ahead of time.

Registration forms must be done online at the JSA site. Instructions will be provided for parents. Failure to register online and on time will keep your child from participating.

Deadlines for regattas will be given out.

Parent of the Day

POD

Every parent must contribute to our Parent of the Day program known as POD. Attached you will find a summary of POD responsibilities. Parents who are unable to sign up for the POD program will be assessed \$100. Parents who sign up for the POD Program and do not show up for their assignment will be assessed \$150. If you are unable to attend you can make arrangements to have another parent with a child in the program substitute for you.

POD Responsibilities

Thank you for volunteering for the day to be the POD! We appreciate your support. Please use the following list as a guideline for your responsibilities.

Carry the POD pack with you throughout the day.

Your pack contains: sunscreen, emergency medical numbers, pen and clipboard, daily report form, and a small first aid kit. You will not be asked to do any major first aid, but please report any first aid that is administered to an instructor and note such aid on the report form..

Put on a POD name tag, so that you may be identified by sailors.

Record any notes you may have on the record sheet. Comments, suggestions, etc. are all extremely helpful.

Morning Routine:

- Help gather sailors for start of class: First and Second Year Optis (On-shore Optis) in Jr. Room/Beach area.
- At 10:00am, collect sailors and Instructor lunch orders –Deliver sheet to the kitchen.
- Be present on the deck or beach so that instructors can find you if they need you. You may be asked to help Optis off the beach-please try to not do things for the sailors; rather, remind them to help each other. Teamwork is our favorite word! As sailors launch, you may help them pull up their dollies.

Lunch Routine:

- Please eat your lunch before or after Jr. Sailors (12:30-1:30pm). Lunch hour is your biggest responsibility!
- At 12:30pm, sailors will be dismissed for lunch. Please distribute lunches and beverages and handle any problems sailors may have acquiring what they have ordered.
- Remind them to clean up.
- Remind sailors to clean up and help usher them down to the Jr. Room. Please walk through the locker room and make sure all sailors get to class in a timely manner.
- If lunch tables are left a mess, ask an instructor to send some sailors up to help you clean up.

Afternoon Routine:

- The afternoon is pretty mellow. Please remain on the beach or deck so that instructors can find you if they need you.
- At 4:00pm, please go down to the beach and help sailors with their dollies, etc.
- At the end of the day, please give the POD pack back to head instructor.

A Few Notes:

- Please maintain a positive presence. Encourage sailors to rig quickly and help each other.
- Please report any misbehavior to an instructor immediately, so that it can be handled. Record this on your clipboard.
- If you are asked to sit with a sailor for disciplinary reasons, try to make this time as boring as possible for them.

Registration :

Return application to the Junior Sailing Mailbox in the front office. Fees will be billed to your account. A \$250 deposit is required by March 01 (members enrolling more than one of their children in the program will need a \$250 deposit for first child and \$100 deposit for each additional child). After March 1st Member pricing will increase.

Please note that the Junior Sailing Program is not involved with locker assignments. Please contact the Office if you need a locker. Lockers are assigned on a first come, first serve basis.

Payments and Refunds:

Refunds will not be made for vacation time or days missed. No child may begin the program unless all fees are paid in full, the releases and statement of understanding signed and returned. Sales tax will be added to all fees. The Junior Sailing Committee reserves the right to excuse a sailor from the program at any time. The Junior Sailing Committee also reserves the right to review the placement of a sailor in a particular class.
